

Pittsfield, Civil War historian and author of several books including "Stand Firm Ye Boys from Maine" will speak about the role of Elisha Coan of the 20th Maine Regiment, Elisha Skinner Coan was born in Exeter in 1843 en. listed at the age of 19, and fought under Joshua Chamberlain. He was 20 years old and a member of the Color Guard when he took part in the famous battle of Little Round Top. Cpl Coan became Doctor Coan after the Civil War when he was graduated from Bowdoin medical school. He practiced medicine in Garland from 1875 to 1887. During that time he also represented Garland in the Maine Legislature and served on the school board.

Just before taps are played by Hannah Edgecomb of Mt. Desert, balloons will be passed out to the crowd and Marielle Edgecomb will read the poem "Freedom's
