



Family Eyecare marks 35 years of providing medical eye care in Piscataquis County

DOVER-FOXCROFT - In the fall of 1979, Dr. David Frasz opened his office on the second floor of the old Mayo Hospital building, sharing it with his wife Dr. Lesley Fernow. They were among an influx of new physicians to the area after the "new" Mayo Hospital opened in 1978. Most of that original group of practitioners, such as doctors Richard Swett, Gary Parker, James Berry. Don Underwood and physician assistant Bill Bisbee, have since moved or retired but their contributions to the community endure.

"And Dr. Fernow and I are still here!" Frasz said. Although he plans to stop doing eye surgeries by the end of this winter, he will still maintain his busy office practice and refer those patients needing surgery to physicians best able to take care of their needs. "I've already spoken to some of my colleagues in Bangor. Our patients will be able to stay with our office, go to Bangor or elsewhere for their surgery, then return to our office as our patients if they wish to do so.

There were a few speed bumps opening his practice in 1979. "Both the general public and the hospital weren't quite sure what I was," Frasz laughed.

He is a board-certified ophthalmologist, a medical doctor and

surgeon specializing in eye care. "They were very happy to have my wife, an internist, but they thought I just did glasses and eye exams. So there were delays in getting approval from the state to offer eye surgery at the hospital." This resulted in one seriously injured eye patient having to be transferred to another hospital. "Unfortunately this caused a delay of care." Frasz was upset and contacted the Bangor Daily News. "An article appeared on the front page the next day and approval from the state came very fast after that," he smiled.

Dr. Frasz' office is now located in the old Little Red School House building, at the corner of Route 7 and Lawrence St. where he and his assistants take care of surgical patients but also provide regular eye exams and prescriptions for glasses. His staff have been with him for many years and have the experience needed to handle a wide variety of patient problems and concerns.

"All of our medical assistants are certified," he noted. One of his staff, Lebra Bergeron, has been with him since the beginning. "Usually patients call and ask for Lebra, not me!" Frasz

He said that the emphasis has always been on service, conve-

Evecare usually answers phone calls from patients the same day and saves space on the schedule for emergencies. MacInnes Optical offers glasses in its shop across the street.

Dr. Frasz also introduced to the area such innovations as combined cataract and glaucoma laser surgery. "It's been very rewarding. Some of our patients have been with us for 20 or 30 years," he added.

The office tries to keep fees reasonable, especially for patients without insurance. "Patients need to be careful. Occasionally they will be offered a surgery, particularly laser surgery, which their insurance might not cover. Then they are stuck with a considerable out-of-pocket expense," he warned.

Why has Dr. Frasz decided to continue his practice instead of simply retiring? He explained that he is "holding on" in order to try to attract another ophthalmologist to take over and to mentor and orient the new physician to the practice and the community.

"If I close the office, not only are my employees out of a job, but it would be very hard to re-establish a similar practice in the future." Frasz noted that the office

nience and expert care. Family equipment and instruments for measuring eves makes ophthalmology the most expensive specialty to start up and maintain on a daily basis. "A service call for our laser costs \$900, and that's before the cost of any parts," he

has found an optometrist Dr. Alesia Higgins from Old Town to help him part-time with the office practice only, on Mondays. "She's very knowledgeable and has fifteen years of experience. Her patients love her. I was lucky she as available."

Dr. Frasz remains optimistic about eventually finding the ideal physician for the community as his replacement.

"While this process has been frustrating, I am confident we will find the perfect match for our community's needs. But until that time, I want to ensure all of my patients that we will continue to serve them in the reliable and caring manner they have come to expect from us. And again, I'm not leaving, I just won't be performing surgery after this winter," concluded Dr. Frasz.

Moosehead Lake Fishing Report

GREENVILLE - "I've never seen the lake so low!" and "I've never seen the lake so high!" are two statements we hear a lot in the Regional IFW office.

Anglers and lake residents are keenly aware of the changes in lake elevations since it impacts their ability to access the water, maintain their docks, and in general, impacts the aesthetics of the area. Hydropower operators on our larger impoundments like Moosehead Lake, Brassua Lake, and Indian Pond have obtained a federal license from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) and water quality certification from the State of Maine (DEP) to operate the dams. Their licenses include required minimum flows in the outlets and a range of operating flows during certain periods of the year. Lake elevation targets are also part of the agreements. The goal of a license is to balance the need for power generation with protection of the aquatic resources, providing recreational opportunities, and public safety (flood control). State and Federal agencies, as well as other interested groups are all part of the lengthy process to develop a hydropower license. Wilson Pond has a very small-capacity dam and they are not required to have a license but we have worked cooperatively with the past and present dam owners to develop an operating plan that protects the resources.

In general, there are a few goals we have as fisheries biologists regarding water level management. The first and most important goal is to protect the fish species and aquatic community. This is much different than "enhancing" the fisheries which we try to maximize as well. We must first ensure all life stages are protected, including spawning. Wild salmon and brook trout spawn in the streams and rivers in the fall. Their eggs are buried in the gravel and must survive over the winter until hatching in spring. Therefore, we typically require an attraction flow in September and early October to draw the fish into the rivers. A lower flow is required during the spawning to keep fish in the middle of the channel so when March rolls around and flows are typically at their lowest, the eggs remain submerged. A minimum flow that keeps the river channel wetted and provides nursery habitat is required in the winter. For waters like Moosehead Lake and Wilson Pond, we also request dam operators to draw the lake down in October to protect lake trout spawning. Lake trout spawn in the lake in mid to late October on wind swept shoals or shoreline containing large rocky substrate. Lake trout simply broadcast their eggs among the rocks in 4 to 5 feet of water. The eggs overwinter and hatch in early spring. So, it is optimal to have the lake elevation very low while spawning is occurring, then the lake can refill later in the fall. As long as the dam operator does not drop the lake more than 3 to 4 feet from the late fall lake elevation, the lake trout eggs will be protected.

So, when you see the exposed shoreline of a lake this time of year, it is because the dam operators are required to lower the lake as part of their license or agreement and it is for the benefit of the fisheries resources. It also provides for flood protection in the case of heavy fall rain and spring run-off. It is also a great opportunity for residents to inspect and repair their docks.
