# **Corinna Bicentennial Celebration August 11-14, 2016**

#### Corinna Bicentennial celebration includes full weekend of activities

na rolls out the red carpet for its 200th birthday on the weekend of Aug. 11-13 with a lengthy list of family-friendly events.

The Penobscot County town, which was named Corinna after the daughter of one of its founders – Dr. John Warren of Boston - has evolved from a farming and industrial community to a quieter, residential community.

The bicentennial celebration will honor Corinna's past, present and future.

The weekend begins with Ladies of the Era Pageant on Thursday, Aug 11 from 5-8 p.m. at Corinna Elementary School, featuring music by the H.J. Crosby Community Band.

Pageant events include a meet

rium. Admission is \$6 per person. The Bicentennial Parade gets under way Saturday, Aug. 13 at 9:30 a.m. It begins at the corner of Elliot Street and St. Albans Road, turns onto Hill Street and Main Street to Route 7, crossing over Route 7 onto the Exeter Road and

dispersing on Winchester Avenue. Spectators are asked to stay on the sides of the roads that the parade route will follow. Parade participants will have walkers to hand out candy to those on the sidelines.

the main stage. #### Corinna's landscape has changed dramatically over the years

CORINNA - It was first called T4 R4 NWP (or Township 4, Range 4, North of the Waldo Patent).

But after Dr. John Warren of Boston bought more than 23,000 acres from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and built a combination sawmill and grist mill, the town was incorporated in 1816 and named Corinna after Warren's daughter.

Corinna evolved from a farming community to a small industrial center after the arrival of the Newport Railroad in the 1860s.

There were sawmills, textile mills, boot and shoemaking shops, an iron foundry and a door, sash and blind factory.

Two of the largest employers in town were the Eastland Woolen Mill and Snow Flake Canning Company, and their demise dramatically changed the layout of the community. In January 1968, firefighters from Corinna, Dexter and Newport battled a blaze that destroyed the Snow Flake Canning Co. and forced the evacuation of 24 families threat-ened by the presence of two ammonia tanks used for refrigeration. According to pub-

lished reports, 200 people on the two evening shifts were apparently evacuated safely. Snow Flake packaged frozen vegetables, dehydrated potato flakes and potato prodIn 1996, Eastland Woolen Mill closed its doors after 90 years in business, eliminating 250 jobs. Many attempts were made to save the mill when the market for its products was threatened by cheaper imports, and the Financial Authority of Maine loaned the company \$1 million in 1993 to shore up its finances.

But when the property went on the auction block in 1997, there were no bidders and the structure was eventually demolished. It took years to clean up the contamination from dyes with the solvent chlorobenzene used in the manufacturing process.

In 2000, demolition of the mill began and eventually, Main Street was rerouted after the town's few remaining stores closed and the Parian Masonic Lodge relocated to nearby Stetson Road.

Six years later, Corundel Commons, a senior citizen's housing project, was built behind the former Eastland property.

One aspect of community life has not changed in more than a century, however.

The major landmark in Corinna and the center of community activity is the Levi Stewart Free Library which also houses the town's municipal







